27th Annual "Biggest Little Car Show"



"Wow, what a great show you had this year" This is the comment I found on my voice mail when I got home after the show. I heard similar comments throughout the day of the show and over the next several days from those that attended. We added a theme, "Celebrating the First Mustangs" and brought back MCA Judging. I'm happy to report we had (8) 1964 ½ Mustangs including Ron DuPratt's at the show and (13) 64-70 Mustangs entered in the MCA Judging. We had 141 total entries including 8 pedal cars. There were 8 vendors with American Mustang, Shaw's BBQ., and Cockrell Dry Car Wash returning from last year. New vendors included Evelyn's Custom Earrings, Suisuncitypatch.com, Operation Lifesaver, Mike Morello Collector Signs, and Verizon. The Verizon Indy Car and

Simulator Display was by far the busiest, the Verizon team was amazing and gave special attention to all the kids.

Our first show car, a 2008 Shelby GT350 Tribute car arrived in line at 5:45 AM. A mass of club members began setting up the area at 6:00 and we were ready to roll by 6:45. By the time registration opened up at 7:00 there were over 30 cars waiting. Like a well choreographed dance routine Norma and her crew checked cars in while Bob Loya and his crew parked them. This was no small feat as we had three separate car groups and parking areas. The GHMC club cars again parked along the South side of Solano Street while the MCA cars were directed to the waterfront sidewalk. As always the show-n-shine cars started out on the lawn and then spilled over onto walkways surrounding the plaza.

MC Gaylord Gee and DJ Joe Latona kicked off the opening ceremonies at 10:00 and The Brotherhood of Vietnam Veterans once again provided the color guard, I can't thank them and all veterans enough for protecting our freedom. Our club presented them with a 2011 High Five Tour Challenge Coin as a special Thank You. The raffle kicked into high gear and our crack team of judges began looking over the MCA cars under the direction of our club's regional MCA director Bill Banovitz. Apparently the word got out and we had entries from as far away as AZ and WA, both of which drove the entire distance. Grumpy and Carol Post from Fountain Hills, AZ edged out Mike Godwin from Bremerton, WA for the Long Distance Award by a mere 21 miles. - (cont. on pg 6)

After the show most of the GHMC members at the show went to the Cast Iron Grill for dinner.

Congratulations to Robin Paulsell and Bob Haran of leading the club to a huge success. I would like each and every GHMC member to thank Robin and Bob for a great car show! I also want to personally thank the GHMC members who helped with this year's car show. There were a few members who did a lot of organizing and behind the scenes work before the car show, many members who set-up and worked during the car show and a lot of members who helped in the clean-up after the show.

Mike Neff of John Force Racing leads the NHRA Full Throttle Drag Racing Funny Car Series standings in Ford Mustang based NHRA Funny Car race car.

We also have a full future calendar of events. They are: our annual camping trip at Lake Francis on June 23rd- 26th; the 20th annual Cruisin in the Sun car show in Pinole on June 26th; Torchlight parade in Benicia on July 3rd; Fourth of July parade in Fairfield and BBQ at the Bano's house; the annual GHMC garage sale at the Lopezano's on July 9th; joining Colonel John Folsom's High Five Tour on July 12th; GHMC car show wrap-up meeting on July 14th; a NorCal meeting in Pleasanton on July 15th; a park-n-ride clean-up in Suisun on July 21st and the 2nd annual Grillin' and Chillin' Rib and Chili Cook-off car show in Dixon on July 23rd.

Please continue to bring Mission Solano food donations and Troop donations to the events and meetings. These causes are very important to our club. - **President Kirk Stafford**

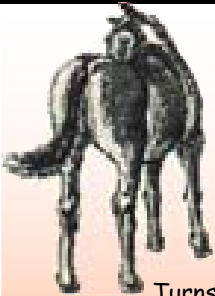




Sunshine Corner

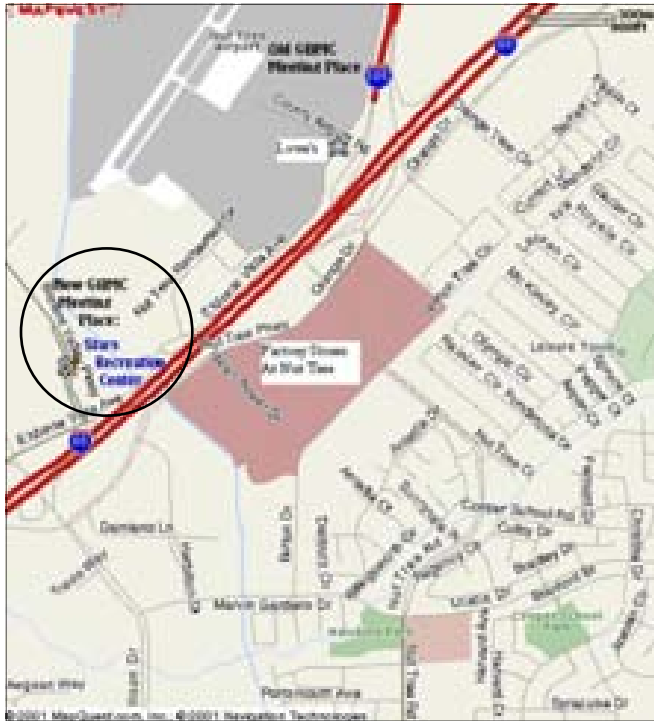
