# SS RED OAK VICTORY

April 10, 2011



Once again GHMC club members crossed the Carquinez Straits and gathered at the Vista Point for an exciting trip to the SS Red Oak Victory Ship in Richmond, CA. This time the sky was clear, the view was awesome, and the CHP stayed away. We were joined by members from the Northern California Cruisers and the Napa Valley Cruisers. In all 29 people in 10 Mustangs, 2 classic Chevy's, and 1 Dodge truck filed onto I-80 westbound for the hop down to Point Richmond and the old Kaiser Shipyard #3 where the SS Red Oak is berthed. Upon arrival the ship's crew had us line up our cars along the end of the pier directly opposite the ship, this made for some great photo ops. We made our way up the boarding stairs one by one and out onto the starboard aft deck of the ship where we paid for our breakfast. Now it was time to eat so we filed into the ship's cabin where we were served pancakes, eggs, and bacon or sausage and then escorted back out onto the port side of the ship to our reserved tables. The view of the San Francisco Bay with the Bay Bridge, the City, Alcatraz, and Angel Island was spectacular. After breakfast we split up into groups of 6 to 8 and began our tour of the ship. 
