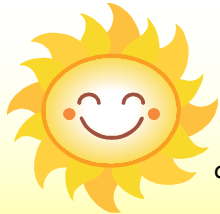

2011 GHMC Raffle Pedal Car

Most of you know about the club's tradition of raffling off a pedal car annually to raise money for our scholarship funds. I was honored to be asked to run the program for 2011 after taking over the 2010 program from Rick Reppert in mid-2010. My first thought was this year's pedal car had to be a Mustang so after receiving Board approval a new reproduction Red Mustang pedal car was purchased. My second thought was a stock pedal car just wouldn't do so we took it apart and customized it at my shop (East Bay Classics). The car was treated to a complete 2-stage repaint in black with silver stripes, and then a custom grey leather seat with a running pony embroidered in the back was installed. Added to that were some cobra decals and pony emblems for a one

of a kind Mustang pedal car. 500 tickets were printed with a picture of the car on them and we were in business.

The first outing for the car was the Goodguys car show at Pleasanton Fairgrounds in March where it was entered and received an award in the pedal car class. Throughout the rest of the year the car was displayed at many of the car shows and events on the club's calendar, each time selling a few more tickets. By the time Fun Ford Sunday rolled around we had sold just over \$600 worth of raffle tickets and this was the day for the winner to be drawn. I was happy to turn the car over to Bill Watkins and Sue Calvert who managed to sell nearly \$250 worth of tickets while selling out. The drawing was held with the winner announced; unfortunately the winner was not present but was contacted later in the day. The winner David Fernandez of Lathrop purchased his ticket at the Mustangs Plus car show in April and agreed to receive his prize at the next Mustangs Plus car show in October.

On Saturday October 22nd at Mustangs Plus we presented the Mustang pedal car to David Fernandez, he has 3 young girls at home and he assured us the car will get a lot of use. David is also considering entering the car in the pedal car class at our 2012 car show in Suisun. This year we raised nearly \$600 for the club's scholarship fund. *-Robin Paulsell*

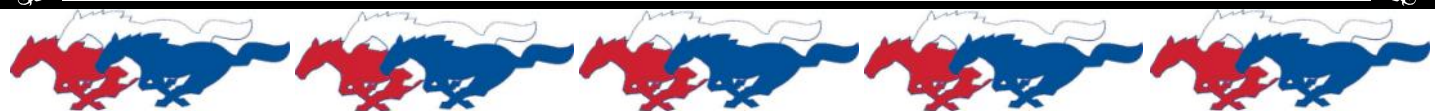

CG Rescue 1705 & Vengeance 38
October 29, 2011

It reminded us of how special our armed forces are, and how they put their lives on the line every day for our freedom. Seven Coast Guard members and two Marines lost their lives while 1705 was out on a rescue over the ocean in Southern California two years ago.

The ceremony was done very nicely. The highlight was when a Coast Guard C-130 did a low fly over.



The memorial is a bronze C130 on top of a rock pillar surrounded by a walk way of pavers, one of which thanks to the members of the GHMC donated.

After the ceremony we went into the hanger where they had food and drinks.

Tony McGrath was seen climbing aboard one of the C-130's on display. As few of us walked around and chatted with members of the Coast Guard family and took photos.

On 8 October the Nut Tree Airport and the Travis Air Museum held their 3rd annual Mustang Days at the Nut Tree Airport. This year the Golden Hills Mustang Club, the Sacramento Mustang Club, and the Sierra Mustang Club were invited to attend. Also attending were 6 real North American P-51 Mustang fighter planes from the World War II era. There were also 4 3/4 scale Mustang replicas, numerous other Classic War Birds, and trainers, including a rare German FW-190 WW II Fighter.



The GHMC Mustangs assembled at the Lowes parking lot at 7:30 am. We then proceeded down the street, entered the airport property and moved to our assigned display area. The shine rags soon appeared as we gussied-up our Mustangs in preparation for their close up photo-op with the Jelly Belly P-51 Mustang. A professional photographer was present to take pictures of our Mustangs. After their moment to shine,

we returned them to the display area, and members ventured out to take in the various vendor's displays and aircraft. Our good friends and members Bill Stephenson and Brian Kelly from Ron DuPratt Ford had set up an impressive display with a couple of their new Mustangs, including a 2012 California Special. The Travis Jimmy Doolittle Museum, the Solano Sheriff Department, Solano International Plastic Modeler Society, and a Military reenactment group also had displays. There were airplane rides that could be bought, including a raffle for a chance to fly in a real P-51 Mustang, (Sorry Suel!). Food you ask? 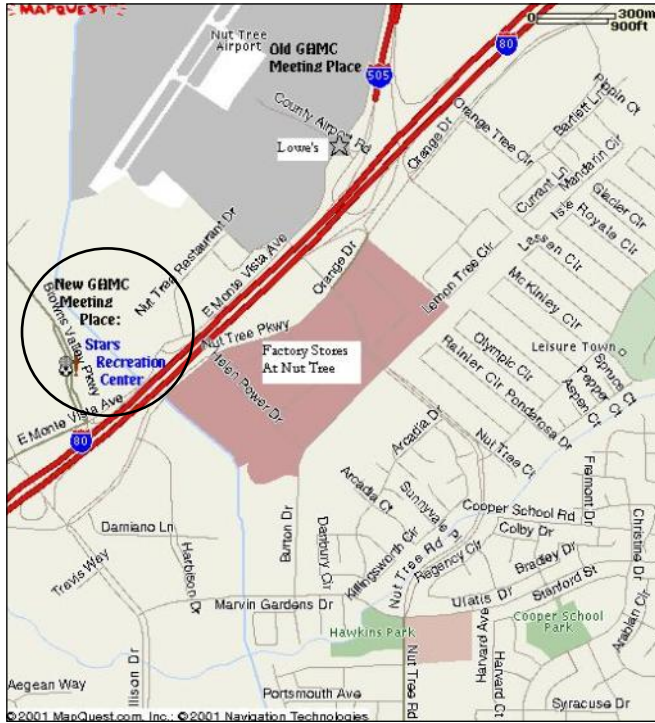
