

Tech Tells 2.0 By Paul Troxell

Because I participated in an autocross event last month and some of you were amazed at the condition of the tires on my car after the event, I thought that I might talk a bit about tires this month. Yesterday I was inspecting those tires, because I will be participating again at an event at Sonoma Raceway this coming weekend.

I was very pleased with the condition of my Michelin Pilot Sport 4S tires when I removed them from the car. Because I had inflated them properly and monitored the tire temperatures during the event I had no surprises or indications of abnormal wear. The tires performed very well, as I had expected, and were in great condition to be used for this next event. I do not have the luxury of having a second set of wheels and tires to run for track use or street use so I am very diligent about monitoring tire inflation pressures and tread wear.

Keep in mind that tires are a "consumable" item on our vehicles. Regardless of how they are used and maintained they are going to wear out and will need to be replaced. Really, tires are no different than engine oil, filters, transmission fluid, etc. They were never designed to be life of service parts and then disposed of with the entire vehicle which is the world that we live in today. So, when are tires supposed to be replaced?

Well, that is a question that has many answers. And the first way to answer it is with "Well, that depends..." If one drives 10 -15,000 miles per year then the answer is when the tread depth reaches minimum. Most of us have done so throughout our lives and not questioned it because it made complete sense. But, what about those who have cars that they only put on 3-4000 mile a year? The tread on these tires is not going to wear down to the minimum tread depth in that same 4-year time frame, so is it OK to keep driving them for 10-13 years until they do wear out?

Absolutely not! Tires, like all things that exist on earth, age. The rubber that they are made with has anti-oxidants in it to help slow this aging process, but it does not stop it. Another condition that ages tires is heat. Not just the ambient heat that the tires exist in, but the heat that they generate as they are rolling down the road, going around corners, and carrying the weight of the vehicle. Each and every time a tire goes through a heat cycle the rubber compound is changed and its performance characteristics are changed. The most common is that rubber becomes harder and the grip of the tire gets lower. Have you ever noticed how hard those old tires ride now compared to when they were new?

Another thing that affects the aging of a tire is whether the car is stored indoors or outdoors. Vehicles stored outdoors are exposed to sunlight that degrades the rubber just as it does the paint and plastic on the vehicle. With high performance summer tires like the Michelin Pilot Sport 4S the rubber compound will begin to crack if the tires are driven on at temperatures below 40 degrees. So, it is very important to inspect your tires regularly whether they are high performance or not. Consider that Paul Walker, an actor in the Fast and Furious movie series died in an accident in a Porsche Carrera GT, one of the highest-performance models in the automaker's history. An investiga-

tion determined that the Porsche was driving on 9-year-old tires and traveling at speeds between 80 and 93 mph when the driver, Roger Rodas, who also lost his life, lost control and collided with a power pole and several trees. This tire age warning also applies to spare tires. It is difficult for the thrifty man or woman to replace a tire that has never been on the ground, but has timed out age wise. How often have you put a new set of tires on your car or truck and only bought 4? Have you considered the sanity of putting that 10-year-old spare on the car when you are on your way home late one evening? The cost of one more tire would have been miniscule to the accident that could follow.

Many automakers, including Ford, Nissan and Mercedes-Benz, tell owners to replace tires six years after their production date regardless of tread life. That is six years from the tire manufacture date, not the date that you purchased the car. It is easy enough to determine the "born on" date of the tire. Simply locate the four-digit code on the sidewall of the tire. The first two digits are the week of the year that the tire was manufactured. The second two digits are the year. So, if you found a code that read 1121 that would indicate that the tire was made on the eleventh week of 2021. If you encounter a three-digit code that means that the tire was manufactured prior to 2000 and you should not use the tire at all, unless it is on your trailer queen that only goes to shows and back to the garage. DO NOT DRIVE ON TIRES THIS OLD.

So, my advice here is to take the time to learn how to properly maintain your tires to get the best performance and tire life out of them. If you are not sure of how to do this, take your car to a respected tire shop and have them rotated and balanced if needed. Any good shop will inspect the tires and give you advice on their condition and what you need to get the best life out of them.

As for me, I am going to extract the fun and excitement that I want from my tires driving the car at events because I am not going to be able to wear them out mileage wise in the time that they will be safe to drive on. I am not any different than the next guy or gal in that it would be disappointing to take a set of tires off of my car and buy replacements if the tread was not worn out. I am also not the guy that risks my life or the lives of others around me by driving on tires that are aged out. All it takes is just a moment to ask oneself the question and give an honest answer. Not only your life, but the lives of others depend on it.


