As always, thank you ALL for continuing to support the many contributions we make in our community! That's what we do best!! See you soon!





Upon arriving, The Cobra Experience provided drivers with a goodie bag containing goods and a short "Manual Manual" as an overview to driving stick shift. We gathered around at the front of the museum and watched as the lineup of cars to be driven arranged in the parking lot. Before any driving, we had the honor to meet some amazing people who would be our driving instructors per car. Carroll Shelby International Executive Vice President, Tracey Smith, 22-year-old drag racing phenom, Kaylee Crayton, Racecar driver and automotive journalist, Colin Comer, Bay Area local race car driver, Tommy McCarthy, and Hagerty Territory Manager, Ian Flanagan.

The Cobra Experience put on a demonstration using actual car parts to explain the clutch and help drivers visualize what happens when the gears are shifted and how the clutch interacts with the transmission to connect or disconnect the flow of power without turning off the engine.

The lineup of cars were a wide variety of vehicles, some from the museum, others from volunteers. The idea was that all cars have a different driving experience and that we would have the opportunity to try each one. There were five cars total: a 1965 Shelby Mustang GT350 (from the museum), a 1984 Volkswagen Rabbit GTI, a Ford F-350, a Nissan Pathfinder, and a 1963 Shelby Cobra (from the museum). Each car was in fact very different and the stories behind the cars were even more unique. The Shelby Cobra was actually used in the movie *Ford vs. Ferrari* directed by James Mangold. The GT350 is one of 562 built in 1965.

The actual driving itself is definitely a skill that takes practice and patience. Even within the few hours of learning and driving, we were only able to cover the basics of stick shift driving.

My favorite cars to drive were the GT350 and the Cobra. The GT350 was loud, but the louder the better, right? And the Cobra was actually a pretty smooth drive. Also, the GT350 cruised nicely in the first gear. Both cars overall were fun to drive... and maybe their looks had a contributing factor to being favorites too.

As a driver who's only driven automatic previously, this was an entirely new experience. It almost felt like learning how to drive for the first time again. One of the best parts about driving stick shift was feeling more in control of the vehicle and there is something satisfying about knowing you are more in control of the car's performance.




