



# Planes, Trains and Automobiles





# Tech Talk 2.0

Well, let's talk about some technical things this month. In the months that I have been writing this column, along with other guest writers, we have expounded on the many things that make up our toys called cars. One item that I have never mentioned, and which is the most important system of any vehicle is the driver. In all of the types of automotive racing known to us who is the one person that gets more attention on a race team? You are correct if you said the driver. And, indeed they are a VERY important part of a race team. I hope that you caught that last word, TEAM. Without a team there is no race car driver.

Now what in the heck does that have to do with this month's diatribe? I would like to concentrate on the driver. You are the most important system in the automobile. Even with all of the systems that are now standard on vehicles such, YOU are still the singular most important part. Sure, anti-lock brakes increase safety, traction control, stability control, and active cruise control all make the vehicle safer. Back up cameras and 360-degree cameras are cool. Bluetooth so that we can yap on the phone while we are supposed to be driving, arguably, can be considered a system that increases safety. But, of all the things on our cars, YOU are the most important "system" that is onboard. So, it is just as important to keep ourselves operating and in good condition as it is to have our cars serviced at the proper intervals. Obviously, we should avoid driving while we are sick or not feeling well. Being overly tired is another time to avoid driving. And, obviously, never drive while under the influence of alcohol or any drugs which inhibit our physical or mental abilities.


So, we are in good shape and ready to drive. Ask yourself this question: How well can I drive? This is not an easy one, mostly because we have a tendency to not be honest with ourselves when it comes to judging our abilities. Most often the majority of us tend to believe that we are more capable than we really are. That is why we have sore backs and muscles when we take on a home project that is really much bigger than we are willing to admit and/or not willing to pay someone else to do. We have our Mustangs and other vehicles that we can talk about at length and quote all of the magazine stats on horse power, torque, bore, stroke, zero to 60 time and quarter mile times, but can you *drive* it? Take a serious moment and just ponder that question and try to be honest with yourself.

Well, this scribe had to take a test. While I have been driving for nearly 54 years and have done some really ridiculous things on the street with cars (that at the time I always claimed were demonstrations of skill) I finally decided that it was time to spend a day at an autocross event.

As I have already told many of you that I have talked to about this, I learned more about my Mustang in that one day than I had learned about the car in the previous eight years that I have owned it. Sure, I have done some hole shot starts from stop lights. I have taken trips on winding and hilly roads at speeds that may have exceeded the posted limits. And I have put the brakes on really hard just to see how good they are. But, if you really want to learn what the limits of your car are, autocross is a good place to start. The speed is generally low. Most of the time you will be doing 25-35mph. You will be accelerating at what feels like ridiculous rates and braking hard in order to make the very tight turns on the course. You will be able to figure out "the line" which will help you to get through the course at higher speeds and shorter times. In a very short time, you will figure out how to modulate your throttle application to keep from spinning the tires because spinning tires keep you from going fast. And learn how to use the brakes to get more front grip so that you are able to keep the car on the line that you want. This and much, much more can be accomplished without going 100+ miles per hour on public roads or on a proper race track at great risk to life and property.

Another thing about doing this is that it is so much fun! I arrived at 8:00am and checked in after preregistering online. At 8:30 there was a driver's meeting where the rules were explained and safety issues were discussed. We were separated into three groups at registration and each group was given a parade lap on the track so that we could familiarize ourselves with the layout. There were half hour sessions for each group until noon. After 12:00 it became an open track which means that everyone could just get in line and run as many times as they liked. It was fun to watch in the morning while not on the track to see how other drivers ran the track. Skill was on display with some of the drivers and the lack of was also well displayed. It was very easy to learn from watching and I found no one that was not willing to answer questions and offer advice. My first laps were not anywhere near quick as I learned the track and felt the response of the car to the changes that I made each circuit. I used the thinking that smooth is fast. So, I concentrated on smooth application of throttle and brakes along with choosing the "line". Since the track is set up in one of the large parking lots at the Sonoma Raceway and is marked out by cones, there are things that one needs to navigate around in order to maintain the best traction. There were steel plates that cover various under-

ground utilities that don't offer the best traction. There were corners that were off camber that create different inputs that are needed to get through the turn. And, yes, there are concrete k-rails. You know those concrete rails that they set up on the highway when there is construction? Those concrete rails that can do one helluva lot of damage to your car. Well, don't worry, they are there, but if you hit one of those either you should not be allowed to drive nails in butter, your throttle stuck wide open, or you had a narcoleptic episode. They are a good distance from where you will be, but they are there for safety.

Here is the best part of participating in an autocross event. You are going to have the most fun that you have ever had with a car. Even more fun than those nights when you were a teenager and were cruising looking for races and for us guys, girls. Even more fun than painting a fence, watching a baseball game, barbecuing ribs, or winning a \$5.00 lottery ticket. While learning all of this car control and enjoying being around other gear heads who actually take their toys out and play with them, you will be taking photos and video and nearly forgetting to eat lunch to keep your brain fed. You will be drinking plenty of water or whatever you like to hydrate with and making those walks to the bathrooms to... well you know. I can guarantee you that you will be making the walk back from the bathroom with the corners of your mouth pinned to your ears without even realizing it because you are having such a good time!

What? Oh, you aren't going to take your little sweetheart out there and possibly scuff those sidewalls that you massage regularly? You don't want to wear out the tires a bit to find out what your Mustang can really do? Ok, I have an answer for that too. Ladies take your husbands car. Or, guys, take your wife's car. Don't want to use anything that you own? Well, tell your son that you need to borrow his car or truck. Hell, I would even go as far as renting a car and take it to the autocross! It's not like it has never been done before. In fact, there was a Porsche there that day that had paper plates on it. I wonder? Anyway, I can't encourage you all enough to get out there. Just had another idea! Talk your buddy into taking his car out there and go with him. Ride-a-longs are encouraged and you can even ask other drivers at the event if you can ride along with them. I had a BMW owner jump in with me who said that he had never been in a Mustang before. And when he got out, he said "Damn, that thing pulls hard!"

Autocross is a very good place to learn how to drive your car. You will come out of it a better driver if you


have just a bit of desire to learn your car. Many high-performance cars, when bought new, come with a one-day driving school that includes autocross style training. Two that come to mind are Corvette and Mercedes AMG. The cost for my one-day of fun was \$150.00 registration. The one requirement that they have that adds cost, but only one time, is that you must have a certified helmet. Since I had already purchased one for the drag racing event that I had attended earlier, I was good there. One could buy lunch at the track, but I ain't got time for dat! My lovely wife packed me some samiches and plenty of snacks and water so I could keep fueled up right at trackside. Aaaaand, I think that I might just be able to entice her to give autocross a try, too. She has a need for speed (well, at least you feel like you are doing a hundred miles per hour, but you're not) and this would be a good short-term vaccination for it.

I hope that this might get some of you to consider giving autocross a try. You will come out of it a better driver. Even if you borrow your friends pick up. You will have some of the best fun that you have had in a long, long time. And, when you are keyboard racing or yapping with your friends you will be able to say that you actually did it instead of reading it on a forum or in a magazine. Your friends with think that you went racing and you will achieve a new level of cool that you never had. No, no you won't. You will, however, talk about it for the following week and drive people crazy recounting the good time you had and there is something in that as well.

So, until next month, Keep the Pedal to the Metal and stay between the ditches.



# GHMC ELECTION INFORMATION

## It's that time of year again!

Election time is near and we need to find out who would like to run for office or board position. The board is made up of four elected officers (President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer), the outgoing President, and not less than three, nor more than six members in good standing (current dues paid). Any member in good standing who would like to participate in the management of the club is encouraged to add their name to the ballot. If you are interested in running for office and cannot attend the October meeting, please call President Bob Fentress (see page 2) so that your name can be added to the ballot. Remember, no experience is needed, just willingness to help the club and lots of Mustang spirit! Nominations will be presented at the October General Meeting and nominations will also be taken from the floor at that time. If you want to be nominated for a position and cannot attend the October meeting, please notify the president.


The ballot will be mailed to you in early November and you can either mail it to the P.O. Box or bring it to the November General Meeting.

The following list explains the duties of each office:

- ★ **President:** Presides over club meetings-board & general (calls meetings to order; announces sequence of business to be discussed; recognizes members entitled to the floor, calls for motions on any questions when necessary, adjourns the meetings, and delegates duties as needed, including the handling of club correspondence), and signs all contracts or other instruments or writing approved by the Board of Directors.
- ★ **Vice-President:** Presides over club meetings-board and general- in the absence of the President; (see President), maintains the club calendar, and is the contact member for members interested in chairing club activities.

- ★ **Secretary:** Keeps a record (minutes) of club meetings-board and general; maintains a club roster (unless another officer or board member is assigned to do so); keeps record books of club by-laws and minutes; as well as any amendments thereto, and any other significant reports; prepares and mails election ballots; may prepare an agenda for each meeting if so requested by the president; prepares/responds to club correspondence as directed; and performs other duties as prescribed by the Board of Directors.
- ★ **Treasurer:** Handles club funds (receipts and deposits); balances the club checking account records with the bank account statement monthly; makes a financial report to the membership each month regarding income and expenditures, collects membership dues and other income; handles the sale of club t-shirts; attempts to collect on dishonored checks received by the club; and makes disbursements as authorized by the board.
- ★ Our club provides an MCA membership to all officers during their term
- ★ Any combination of officers may be required to sign checks for disbursements made from the club account.
- ★ At least two officers hold a key to the club mail box and are responsible for collecting mail.

*Editor's note: Something to think about! Without officers, we don't have a club. Several of our officers and board members have served many terms and there is always room for fresh ideas. Please consider stepping up to keep this club fun and active!*


